Community Garden Council Meeting

Minutes (7:00pm Oct 18, 2011)

- I. Call to order: Anthony called the meeting to order.
- II. Approval of last meeting's minutes: Minutes were distributed any changes can be forwarded to Carol

III. Visitor business

a. **Introduce visitors:** Welcome Nadeem & Noah. Congratulations to Tammy and Alisa on the birth of their new babies.

IV. Business

a. Cambridge Official Plan comments (Greg)

Food System Roundtable: Greg received a message from Marc Xuereb. Greg was invited to a Food System Round Table policy review but there were many logistic changes in meeting schedules which left Greg unable to attend. FSRT recruiting membership – Greg will attend.

Cambridge Municipal Plan: Greg sent a submission to the City of Cambridge:

- -suggested definition be in line with Region
- -Commended inclusion in all land use
- -Neighbourhood improvements suggested Community Gardens in "at risk" neighbourhoods
- -Changes in wording

Tammy questioned if input was given to Cambridge Environmental Advisory Committee. Greg did not.

CGC - Greg sent a sheet on ability to sell produce from Community Gardens- states through North America it is a policy to remain not for profit. Greg also worries that gardens will no longer support charities like the food bank.

Action: Greg to send a copy to Tammy who sits on Committee.

b. Meeting and Event Brainstorming with Dan Meagher, Water Services Waterloo Region (Michelle)

Michelle gave an overview of a 6 garden workshop series offered by Water Services - their attendance and events. As there is a need for community gardener education, Michelle and Carol met with Dan to see if there was interest in partnering with CGC/PH. Water Services hires a consultant to co-ordinate the series at various garden centres with exception of Cambridge Community Art Centre. Their cohort is a refined population. They have a great budget. Dan was interested but some concerns were that the sessions always have waiting lists. The sessions

are held in larger Garden Centres which is great for ambience etc., but only hold a 40-60 person capacity. More people could benefit if the sessions were videotaped/web casted. Carol will check in with Public Health to see if there is a budget to offer some webcasting or video taping of the series.

- **Seedy Saturday** has 1 day event with a series of workshops on gardening technique could CGC have a presence there?
- **Promotion of events** tough to connect with gardeners need to "break through" language barriers, room for online community Facebook. There is a need for a communication system. Maybe there is a need for Community Garden mailboxes? Lorraine and Violet are willing to call garden coordinators and ask them to promote events to their gardeners as some co-ordinators are reluctant to provide gardener contact info. Noah is willing to help with graphics.

C. Council Responsibilities (everybody)

- Noah Shumate is willing to join council and to be a part of the garden accessibility project. Noah's background is landscape architecture and he is studying urban agriculture.
- Michelle is interested in taking on the fund raising role.
- Anthony will continue to chair until someone else expresses an interest.
- Nadeem is interested in social media but will make a decision later.

e. Accessible Garden Update (Carol, Anthony)

Anthony provided an update – working on a RFP (Request for Proposals) and a transparent system of hiring a contractor. Anthony provided some details of what's in the RFP.

f. Foodstock/Mega-Quarry Report (Violet, Anthony)

Violet, Greg and Anthony attended the event, featured many local chefs/food. Thousands of people were there to protest the Quarry being installed. Violet circulated postcards to the Minister of Environment. Covered by Global and CTV. The public was mislead – informed the land would be bought for potato farming. g. Council policy regarding for-profit sales of produce (discussion)

Debate: can gardeners from Community Gardens sell produce?

- i. Fanis: yes poverty reduction

Greg moved that "CGC accept spirit of legal definition of Community Gardens being adopted by Municipalities viewed as Not For Profit, but recognize gardener can organize fundraising events for the benefit of the gardeners as a whole" Seconder – Violet

Vote: For: 6, Against: 2. Carried.
